I must confess that it is difficult to think about January

while, at the time of this writing, Christmas is still a week out. How can I write about the new year when we haven't even finished the old one yet? I won't even mention the Christmas shopping that is not quite done yet...

But here we are, on the verge of a new year and a new decade, and in many ways, a lot of us have already started preparing for it. Around my house, we're all looking forward to another year of school. Joie is working on some winter break homework that will earn her a prize when she returns to school. Emilie is rehearsing for her first band concert. Zach is gearing up to begin the application process for seminary. And I am already beginning school work in preparation for my next semester of school.

Even though Christmas will have come and gone by the time you are reading this, I can't help but be reminded of Advent during all of these preparations - especially Mary and Joseph, who both said yes to God. Both knew that society would be working against them, but both also knew that they were chosen and being honored by God.

The parallel between these decisions to be made in first century Bethlehem and those at the edge of 2020 are striking. A lot of us may feel like society is working against the church, which shows up as declining church attendance and involvement. Indeed, we have moved on from a time where participation in church was the default position. It is no longer the case that one church is vying for attention among all of the other religious options; now, church itself is vying for attention among all of the other possible things someone could be involved in.

On top of this, regardless of where you stand on the issues facing the United Methodist Church, there will be a General Conference meeting this spring, which will very likely attempt to further define our mission and goals as a denomination. And regardless of where you land in United States politics, there will be a congressional and presidential election this fall. To my knowledge, there has not been a single US election that has made 100% of the country happy, so we will likely be facing all sorts of division this year.

But before you get too bummed out, remember this: God is still on the throne. God has been on the throne and will continue to be, and I do not believe that God is a silent observer in this world. In fact, I believe that God is urgently calling for our participation in God's mission for the world, and I think that this new year is the perfect time to respond. So, like Mary and Joseph before us, I am inviting you all to join me in saying yes to God and embracing the adventure that awaits us in 2020.

I have been your pastor for half a year now (already!) and I still wake up every day in complete awe and gratitude that I have been called here to this time and place for a mission such as this. I am excited by all of the things that we might be able to do together this year, and I know that God is calling us to big things at Hebron and Oakwood. Saying yes to God can feel risky or scary, and honestly, sometimes it actually is risky and scary. But God promises to be faithful to us, and so we can safely and securely step out in faith into a partnership with God.

Remember, the mission statement of the UMC is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. We cannot participate in this transformation without partnership with God and with each other. As we begin this new year, let us say yes to God in faith, work together in love, and begin a new adventure with joy.

Reaching out to our community....

The <u>Oakwood Area Food Pantry</u> serves the Oakwood School District, Fithian, Muncie, Fairmont, Sidell, Indianaola and Catlin residents. The Food Pantry now has its own building, located at 202 S. Scott Street. The Food Pantry incorporated as a non profit organization and continues to work with the support of the ERIC churches.

The OAFP now provides commodities to over 45 families (or over 85 individuals). It is open every Tuesday from 10:00 am until Noon. Volunteers from the ERIC churches distribute the food, unload the Food Bank Trunk each month, stock the shelves and order and pick up additional items needed throughout the month. Carol Leverenz, Nancy Tyler and Marilyn Elrod are there most Tuesdays and Laura Wittig and Tim and Linda Cunningham are always available to help when called.

The Food Pantry also provides holiday baskets at Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter. The items for these baskets are provided by the ERIC churches. These churches also provide items each mouth to help with things that are hard to get from the Central Illinois Food Bank. Without this support, the Food Pantry would not be able to continue to serve those who need this assistance.

Oakwood UMC provides support through our weekly "noisy bucket" collection and fund raisers throughout the year for our missions. With these funds we are able to provide meat every other month as well as continue to provide monetary support throughout the year. We are indeed blessed to be able help to serve our community.

The <u>Back Pack Program</u> also operates out of the Food Pantry building. Debbie Huddleson of Hebron UMC directs this effort. It provides food for students in need over the weekends when schools are not open to provide meals. The program now serves 15 families with 36 students. She also receives monetary support from the ERIC churches including Oakwood and Hebron. If you have any questions or would like to help, contact Debbie at 217-453-2333

We at Oakwood and Hebron are definitely involved in the community with answering the call to help those who need a little assistance from time to time.

ASP adults traveled to Jonesville, VA from Nov. 3-9 to work on a house that needed major floor repair and a new bathroom.



Lent, the church-year season that begins on Ash Wednesday, is a time of penitence and spiritual renewal. Some people give up a luxury or vice during Lent as a form of self-denial; others undertake a project that benefits others.

The point isn't to denigrate ourselves or to see how much we can do without. Instead, Lent helps us reflect on Jesus' death. As Timothy Keller writes in *The Reason for God:* "The Christian Gospel is that I am so flawed that Jesus had to die for me, yet I am so loved and valued that Jesus was glad to die for me. This leads to deep humility and deep confidence at the same time. It undermines both swaggering and sniveling. I cannot feel superior to anyone, and yet I have nothing to prove to anyone. I do not think more of myself nor less of myself. Instead, I think of myself less."
