One of the things that I've been kind of reluctant to think about this year is the combination of the Advent and Christmas seasons. This is not because I don't like them - I am happy to tell anyone who will listen why Christmas Eve is my favorite day

of the year. And it's not because it feels too early - although, at the time of this writing, we are just now in the second half of October. It's true that remote learning for my kids, my own schoolwork, and being knee-deep in charge conference paperwork has kept me occupied for a while now, but I don't feel too busy to think about my favorite time of the year. So what is it?

I think it's this: we've all had to figure out how to do life differently for quite a while now. We had to be open-minded about our summer plans, we had to adjust to a new school year that doesn't look like it usually does, and most, if not all, of us have dealt with some kind of loss or grief this year. And now we have to figure out the holidays too. No matter how much we love the holiday season, there is a looming extra layer this year; flexibility and creativity are needed the most at a time when we might feel like we're already scraping the bottom of the barrel. This may be true for you. It's definitely true for me. But if there's something I've learned over all of my years serving in various roles within the church, it's that we are often blessed in our service to others, and we often find what we didn't even know we needed when we look beyond ourselves.

It is my sincerest hope that, instead of caving in under the weight of unmet expectations and extra demands on our time and energy, we can make, and find, some meaning together in this upcoming Advent season. I pray that, in spite of the grief, isolation, frustration, or sorrow we feel, we will be able to locate and celebrate hope, love, joy, and peace as we worship our Lord. I have faith that, on the longest of longest nights, we will be able to find our comfort in Jesus as we rest in Him, hearing and believing His words: "Come to me, all you who are struggling hard and carrying heavy loads, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28-29 CEB)

Beloved church, it brings me so much joy to be your pastor. Even during this strange year, it has been my great honor to serve you in different ways. I'm proud of what we've done together. I'm grateful that we have found new ways of connecting with each other, and I'm heartened by the love and strength of this community. It is true that this year's Advent and Christmas observances and celebrations will be different from last year, but I do not expect them to be any less meaningful. And so I hope that you will be able to join us in preparing once again for our Lord in whatever way you can, whether you will be joining us in our sanctuaries or from afar. I will continue to create and post online worship services, including online options for all of the special things we do during Advent. We will continue to meet for worship on Sunday mornings for as long as we are able, and we will find creative ways to observe the Longest Night and Christmas Eve together.

As we sing in the Advent hymn, "People Look East" (United Methodist Hymnal, 202): Angels, announce with shouts of mirth Christ who brings new life to earth. Set every peak and valley humming With the word, the Lord is coming. People, look east and sing today: Love, the Lord, is on the way.

Love is on the way, friends. Love is here. Prepare your hearts. Peace and blessings to you all!

The Advent wreath is a symbol of watchfulness and increasing joy as we anticipate Jesus' birth. The wreath's circular shape symbolizes eternity, or life without end. The candles remind us that Jesus is the Light of the World — he brought light and life to a dark world (see John 1:4-5). On each of the four Sundays of Advent, we light a new candle. As the light grows, so do our hope and joy.

When I take time during Advent to remember in prayer and with gifts of money and time those who have less food than I do, those who are lonely, those without a home; when I pause to share love with a child or an elder, or gratitude for a healthcare worker, pastor or teacher; when I wait for justice to replace oppression but, while I wait, find ways to work for that result ... the Spirit's warmth fills my waiting heart.




