We filled 1,000 rice meals together which will help to feed 6,000 people around the corner and around the world. Thanks be to God.

October 28 was OUMCs Pancake and Sausage Breakfast. This was an awesome opportunity for us to serve together. My thanks to all who helped to make this event a success. Thank you for your generous support of missions.

October 29 brought our second fifth Sunday cooperative worship service as Oakwood/Catlin/Hebron came together at Oakwood. It was an amazing day of worship and fellowship. We had 75 people in attendance. The Oakwood sanctuary was full. It was nice to hear the bells ringing and the choir singing. The lunch was awesome too. Thanks be to God to all who contributed to this special worship and fellowship.

We had two Sundays in a row at 10:00am, one Sunday at 10:30am, and three Sundays at our regular worship time of 9:15am. 	We all know the pastor works 5 days a week, but it's more like 24/7; however, for worship service to be ready on Sunday morning, a bulletin must be written and printed, musician ready to play, power point ready for the congregation to follow on the screens, temperature set for the area to be comfortable, caffe and coffee time prepared, tithes and offering collected and counted for deposit and a record of attendance updated.				
Around the church:	Plants planted, weeded and watered; repairs made to the church from wind and rain damage, grass cut, and sign kept updated.				
Church committees:	 <u>Trustees</u>: make sure the building is kept up and functioning. <u>Worship</u>: decorate the Sanctuary for special seasons, ready communion on the first Sunday of the month, advise the pastor on worship services. <u>Missions and Outreach</u>: raise money for the missions supported by the church by planning the Yard Sale and Pancake Sausage Breakfast. <u>Nurture</u>: welcome church family and visitors to the church, send letters and cards to members, provide assistance and food to those in need. <u>PPRC</u>: help the pastor with concerns of the congregation, make decisions on hiring of paid church personnel, work with the District Superintendent on pastor performance. 				

Other activities by the congregation include: keeping our membership list, putting out a newsletter 6 times a year, developing a budget for the year and paying bills, supporting mission trips for ASP, trips to the Midwest Distribution Center, volunteering at the Oakwood Area Food Pantry, participating with ERIC, working with the Boy Scout troops, helping out with VBS and Bible's Cool.


