

Some ASP Stats:

20 years of youth trips and this fall will be 10 years of adult trips (one year they were together).

Youth-

175 different youth and adults have traveled to central Appalachia.99 of those made multiple trips.47 youth went for 3 or more years. One served on staff for one summer.

28 parents traveled with their youth, with 15 making multiple trips.

Adults –

17 different adults have traveled to central Appalachia.
7 have made more than 5 trips.
5 youth continued to serve by going on 1 or 2 adult trips, with one going 4 times as a youth and 5 times as an adult.

ASP 2022 Adult Trip is scheduled for October 30 to November 5 in Lee County, Virginia. Lets keep them in your prayers.

(FOR WHOSE WHO MIGHT BE INTERESTED IN THE 2023 ASP YOUTH MISSION TRIP)

Dear ——-:

You are receiving this information because, at some time, you expressed interest in the Appalachia Service Project trip. As you may know, Deb Clow has been the individual that has planned this trip for the last 20+ years. Deb has moved away from the area to be with her family, hoping this mission trip will continue. There are several that have stepped up to make this happen.

With Deb's guidance, we are beginning to plan for the ASP 2023 youth trip. The past several years have not been predictable, but ASP has adopted guidelines for COVID19, and they can be found at asphome.org, along with other information about this mission.

This is a youth mission trip, but adults are also needed as group leaders. Each crew consists of (5) youth, and (2) adults are required. The main requirement for adults is to like high school students.

ASP is a weeklong mission trip for junior high and high school-aged youth to rural Central Appalachia to repair homes for low-income families. ASP's goal is to make homes "warmer, safer, and drier." But ASP is more than just a building program. After a few days of hard work repairing homes with ASP, your hands will grow a little tougher, your arms a little stronger, and your relationship with God a whole lot deeper. You will also develop relationships that otherwise you wouldn't ever have. You will return to your community with a passion for service, a renewed compassion for other people, and a fresh appreciation for your place and purpose. Best of all, you will discover first-hand that regardless of geography, education, or economic class, we are all

equal members of the family of God.

If you would like to hear about ASP 2023, we will be presenting our 2022 ASP trip at the following locations:

September 11 – Catlin United Methodist Church – 9:30 AM September 18 – Muncie Baptist Church – 10 AM

There will be a scheduled information meeting on September 18, 2022, at 2:00 pm at Muncie Baptist Church.

At this meeting, information regarding the trip's dates, cost, and fundraising are explained, and this also provides you an opportunity to ask any additional questions you might have. It's requested that a parent be present at this meeting so all information can be provided. Also, remember that adults are needed for this trip and to help with the planning process as we move forward. If you are interested in the trip, but cannot attend the meeting, please email Connie Young at <u>cyoung@lakeviewcol.edu</u>. We will be able to set up another time to meet to discuss the trip.

EXPECTATIONS

Because this is a Christian-based mission and we represent our local area and various churches, youth are expected to be positive role models in all aspects of their life.

COMMITMENT

There will be required hours in education/construction. In the past, the hours have been held once a month on Sunday afternoons starting in January (2 - 2.5 hours each). You and a parent will have a mandatory meeting to turn in forms and cover other last-minute details.

EXPENSES

To confirm your interest in securing your spot, a deposit of \$175 will be due no later than February 10. The trip will cost approximately \$12,000 for three teams (15 youth/ 6 adults). Each youth will need to raise about \$750. Fundraising opportunities will be available. (An additional deposit is due June 1 – If you have not raised at least \$750 – the deposit will be the difference between \$750 and what has been raised)

FUNDRAISING

Last year we were able to sell pumpkins and Texas Roadhouse rolls and host a spaghetti dinner. The ASP committee will continue looking into other fundraisers as the planning process continues.
