Well, Church, we made it! By the time you're reading this, we've made it through most of the Christmas season and Epiphany is upon us. I love Epiphany. I've always been completely fascinated by the journey of the Magi to visit Jesus. People from somewhere else, able to communicate with the Divine through signs and dreams, bringing somewhat mysterious and very symbolic gifts, led by a star... As a kid, it was the perfect story to wrap up the rest of the Holy mystery that we hear of on Christmas Eve.

As an adult - and more specifically as a seminary student and pastor - I've done a bit deeper thinking and studying about Epiphany. The word Epiphany comes from the Greek epiphaneia, which means "manifestation." And this is precisely what Epiphany is - the first manifestation of Jesus Christ to people from somewhere else, to non-Jews, to Gentiles. We learn through the Gospels that later in Jesus' life, it wasn't totally clear that his ministry was for anyone besides the nation of Israel. After all, the prophecies that we read and heed suggest that it is the Jewish people who will be redeemed through the Messiah. Then, through various encounters with Gentiles, we see an acknowledgement that Jesus' ministry is in fact expansive enough to include all. And it all started with Epiphany.

As we begin the new calendar year, many around us will think and talk about and make resolutions. We're all familiar with the statistics surrounding New Year's resolutions - they often do not go quite the way we planned. So I wondered if, this year, maybe we take a cue from Epiphany and think about how God has manifested in our lives. Thinking about all that we are grateful for can help us do this - through gratitude, we can see where God has revealed things to us. One easy way to do this is through gratitude journaling. Journaling is a great spiritual discipline, and is often considered a form of written prayer.

A gratitude journal is pretty much what it sounds like, and if you recall the prayer of Examen that we did together in the fall, this will be somewhat familiar. At the end of each day, recall the moments for which you are most grateful and the moments for which you are least grateful. Write about those moments. Then think about where you saw God and where you felt God's absence that day, and write about those moments too. After a while, you will start to notice things about your gratitude and how you notice the presence of God, and you might make some connections between them that are important for your own spiritual walk. Through your gratitude, you will see how God manifests in your daily life.

I'm terrible at resolutions, but this is one that I will be challenging myself to do. I hope you'll join me this year as we look ahead to the new year, where hope and peace may be a little more prevalent, and where we find love and joy through the presence of God every day. May it be so and amen.
