What a year it has been! I know that so many of us are ready to move on from the events of the past year and put it all behind us as we return to some sense of normalcy. But in the United Methodist Church, the first couple of months of the year are known as "Year-End Report Time," so I've done quite a bit of looking back over 2020 in the past few weeks. I have a love-hate relationship with year-end reports. Prior to being appointed as your pastor, when I worked at the Undergraduate Library at the U of I, a big part of my job was keeping statistics and looking at the story that numbers tell - so I appreciate how powerful data can be. But I also know that numbers don't always tell the whole story. For example, a library circulation desk may see 30 people in an hour. That might seem like a lot, but if you found out that 20 of those 30 people were only stopping by to ask where the restrooms are, it paints a different picture. All of that to say that statistics are useful, but we often need a little more information.

For instance, the views for our YouTube channel don't tell us that we have people from different parts of the state joining us for virtual worship services on Sundays. Our audit helps us see our financial picture, but there is no audit for the time and talent that has been given to our churches over the past year - all of which have kept us going and serving our community, whether our buildings have been open or not. There's not a place in the year-end reports to share about the Facebook Live science experiments we did with the Bible's Cool group, or about offering drive-through Communion, or about how offering a drive-through Christmas Eve experience resulted in some really cold hands and feet - but that serving you, and serving alongside some of you, was totally worth it.

The year end reports don't really cover what we've done in our services either. In addition to reaching people who might not otherwise be able to come to church, our online service has been able to feature different spaces (both church sanctuaries, my house, outside) and different musicians - while Pastor Zach is our regular guitarist, some of my friends and colleagues have stepped in as musical guests too. We've been able to share messages from Bishop Beard that we probably would not have heard in different circumstances, and we have been able to offer some different kinds of experiences too, such as *lectio divina* and a peek at the inside of our sanctuaries at Christmastime.

Our in-person services have allowed us a chance to take some more reflective time with God than we usually get in church. Using a resource for fixed-hour prayer, we hear multiple readings of Scripture, spend a little time in silent prayer and contemplation, and end each service with a spoken word hymn and prayer. Like you, I am looking forward to the day that we can get back to a service that includes singing and responsive readings; but in the meantime, I hope that this service has not just served as a placeholder, but has been meaningful and created a space for deeper connection with God.

Church, I am proud of what we have done during the past year. I am so grateful to you all for allowing me to try new things and for letting me lead you. Every day I am humbled and honored by the call to serve these churches and be a part of your lives. We have done good and important work to help keep our neighbors safe. We are not out of the woods yet, but we are getting closer. Hope is always on the horizon, and I believe that God has been, and continues to be, with us every step of the way.

Oakwood UMC Has An Endowment Fund

As a member of our congregation, you may or not may not be familiar with our Endowment Fund. The fund was created when the future of the church was in question. Gary Ludwig proposed the creation of the Endowment Fund in 1999. This fund ensures the church will be able to move forward even during hard times. A committee of the pastor and a layperson, guided by the district office, created a policy to guide decisions and change as the church changed over time. The original policy was created and passed in December of 1999. Since then our church has changed in many ways and the policy needs to be updated.

The Church Administrative Board has appointed a committee to review and update the Endowment Fund Policy. The committee will make recommendations to the full Board of any changes to the present policy as deemed necessary. Those on the committee are as follows:

Any changes that are recommended will have an explanation for the suggested change to the policy and the reason for the change. A report will be available at the church office for all church members interested in reviewing once the committee members have completed their work.

The congregation will be notified of the time and date for the meeting to finalize the revised document. Once this step is taken, a date will be set for a final vote to accept the revised document.






