October



Well, here we are in September. We've reached the final third of the year that, for any, just won't quit. Regardless of what has happened in our own individual lives, or how we personally feel about all that has occurred so far this year, I think we would all agree that it has been unprecedented. It's far too early to begin looking back for a recap of the year, and for most of us, it's not quite time to make plans for next year yet either. So let's take a look at right now, because, well, we're in it. And we've got some work to do in this moment right now.

There is much happening that divides us today and that is troubling. There will always be things that divide us on some level, but what is troubling is how often and how intensely we allow things to divide us. At the time of this writing, school has begun for the teachers and staff, but not yet for the students in the Oakwood school district; by the time you read this, everyone will have been back in school. That has certainly caused divisions - the discussions I've heard about whether teachers and/or students should be in school and what safety precautions to take have been far and wide. The COVID-19 pandemic has caused divisions too - discussions and opinions about what is necessary, or what is a bridge too far, as we try to navigate our way forward have been in abundant supply. And in case any of us were able to forget, we're in the thick of an election season that, if it hasn't already, threatens to divide us even at the family and household level. None of us is immune to this disease of division, and all of it is disappointing.

And it's not biblical. Although I am much more compelled to hang my hat on the words of Jesus instead of Paul, it is Paul's words in his letters to the Romans and the Ephesians that spring up in my heart when I think about the current state of our world. When we allow things of this world - pandemic and politics alike - to divide us into factions, we are disregarding Paul's encouragement in Romans 12:2: Don't be conformed to the patterns of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds so that you can figure out what God's will is—what is good and pleasing and mature. (CEB) Is it good or pleasing or mature to spew hate or derision about the "other" - no matter what "other" means in any given moment? I suggest, and I suspect Paul would agree, that it is not.

But Paul also talks about unity - as in, the opposite of division. Ephesians 4:2-3 say this: Conduct yourselves with all humility, gentleness, and patience. Accept each other with love, and make an effort to preserve the unity of the Spirit with the peace that ties you together. (CEB) And I think that here we find some good and useful instructions for how we ought to be handling ourselves right now. Is your neighbor responding to COVID in a way that you don't agree with? Have humility - you may not know their entire situation. Is someone down the street promoting a political candidate you don't agree with? Be gentle - their situation may lead them to appreciate different policies than you. Is your family member sharing misleading or misinformed posts on social media? Be patient - they may not know that they have received inaccurate information.

Above all, in these situations and others, accept each other with love. We are all part of the one body in Christ, and we need to honor that by making a commitment every moment towards preserving our unity and peace. There is enough in the world that would seek to divide us; let us instead remember what ties us together.



August 15, 2020

During this virtual conference clergy where appointed to their churches, retiring clergy where received, the list of retiring churches was accepted, reports where received from various Boards of the conference and finally the conference approved the budget for 2021.

The 2021 budget is a reduction from the 2020 budget by a little over 7%, reflecting the struggle many churches are having as a result of Covid 19.

It is also interesting to note that the conference has provided grants to churches to ease their apportionments and our charge also received a gift of \$500 to provide support to the Oakwood Area Food Pantry.

Conference was a totally difference experience and I must admit that I am looking forward to being able to meet in person with over 1000 fellow Christian delegates next year.

If you are interested in this year or next, please contact Deb at 217-799-0594.


